Questions to Ask: Your Child's or Youth's Teacher

Why do you think this is?	
What qualities and behaviors does my child have that you feel helps him/her function well in the school?	
Are there behaviors that concern you?	
Why do you think my child exhibits these behaviors?	



How often do these occur?	
What steps have you taken to minimize these behaviors?	
What type of response did you get from my child?	
Have you reached out to other professionals regarding approaches to help him/her?	
What did they suggest?	
What would you suggest we try now?	
Why do you feel that might be helpful?	
What can we do at home to help?	
Is there anything you need from us?	
How will we keep in regular contact with one another?
